In this moment with SNAP benefits paused amid the government shutdown a growing uncertainty adds to a sense of anxiety among those we serve. H.O.M.E. must rely more-and-more on the generosity of individuals like you. We need help to bring families facing the cold into warmth and safety. Your compassion can be the

Phylicia was just four when her family arrived at H.O.M.E.'s shelter and staff scrambled to make space in our office building for them because the shelter was full. With support from our housing navigators, and donors like you, her family was able to secure stable rental housing. A few years later, her mother was able to purchase a house through H.O.M.E., ending their cycle of housing instability for good.
